WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the County to invest these monies not required for immediate expenditure.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Brown County Treasurer is hereby directed to invest Brown County public funds at the highest rate of interest possible at said time on available monies at financial institutions, as designated by the Brown County Commission, and

FURTHER, to furnish quarterly reports detailing same, as authorized by SDCL 4-5-8.

INTEREST POLICY:

Moved by Kippley, seconded by Fjeldheim to approve the following Policy in regard to interest earned from deposits and investments: State law allows income from deposits and investments to be credited to either the General Fund or the fund making the investment. The County's policy is to credit all income from deposits and investments to the General Fund, except for interest earned on specific certificates of deposits and financial assurance savings account of the Solid Waste Fund. USGAAP requires income from deposits and investments to be reported in the fund whose assets generated that income. Where the governing board has discretion to credit investment income to a fund other than the fund that provided the resources for investment, a transfer to the designated fund is reported. Accordingly, interfund transfers of investment earnings shall occur between the Highway Fund and Solid Waste Fund (excluding specific

solid waste certificates of deposit and financial assurance savings account) and the General Fund. All members present voting aye. Motion carried.

RESOLUTION #12-15

WHEREAS, policies provide a degree of consistency within county government; and

WHEREAS, GASB 2300.106 requires policies in a number of areas be disclosed in the "notes to financial statements".

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Brown County Commission adopt the following policies in compliance with GASB (governmental accounting standards board).

BASIS OF ACCOUNTING: The government-wide financial statements will be prepared using the economic resources measurement focus and the accrual basis of accounting, as will the proprietary fund and fiduciary fund financial statements. Governmental fund financial statements will be reported using the current financial resources measurement focus and the modified accrual basis of accounting. (GASB 1600.103)

REVENUE AVAILABILITY CRITERION: Revenues are considered to be available when they are collectible within the current period or soon enough thereafter to pay liabilities of the current period. For this purpose, Brown County considers revenues to be available if they are collected within (30) thirty days of the end of the current fiscal period.

Property taxes are levied on an annual basis. On the fund financial statements, the portion of the property tax levies that have not been collected by the end of the fiscal year and are not available will be considered deferred revenue. (GASB 1600.106)

<u>CAPITAL ASSETS</u>: Governmental Funds, Non-Governmental Funds and Enterprise Fund. SDCL 5-24 requires all county departments to file a property inventory with the county auditor by January 10th of each year, which shall include all items in the following categories over the stated original cost.

Personal Property Listings – All county departments are required to file an additional list of electronic equipment, furniture, and/or equipment requiring insurance coverage with an original cost less than \$5000. (GASB 1400.102, 104)

OPERATING VS. NONOPERATING REVENUES AND EXPENSES: The Brown County Landfill Fund distinguishes operating revenues and expenses from non-operating items. Operating revenues and expenses generally result from providing services and producing goods relating to the landfill operation. Principal operating revenues of this operation are tipping fees. Non-operating revenues include grants and interest earned. Operating expenses of the landfill operation include salaries and benefits, supplies and depreciation. The loss on disposal of capital assets is a non-operating cost. (GASB P80.118)

GASB AND/OR FASB: Private sector standards of accounting and financial reporting issued prior to December 1, 1989, generally are followed in both the government-wide and proprietary fund financial statements to the extent that those standards do not conflict with or contradict guidance of the GASB. Governments also have the option of following subsequent private sector guidance for the business-type activities and enterprise funds, subject to the same limitation. Brown County has elected not to follow subsequent private sector guidance. (GASB P80.103)

<u>CASH AND CASH EQUILVALENTS</u>: For the purposes of the proprietary fund statement of cash flows, cash equivalents are defined as short-term, highly liquid investments that are both:

- Readily convertible to known amounts of cash
- So near their maturity that they present insignificant risk of changes in value because of changes in interest rates

Generally, only investments with original maturities of three months or less meet this definition. (GASB 2450.105) Examples of items commonly considered to be cash and cash equivalents are checking, money market, cash change, CD's (three months or less) and internal cash management pools.

Brown County's cash and cash equivalents are considered to be cash on hand, demand deposits, and short-term investments with original maturities of three months or less from the date of acquisition.

RESTRICTED AND UNRESTRICTED RESOURCES: When both restricted and unrestricted resources are available for use, it is Brown County's policy to use restricted resources first and then use unrestricted resources, as they are needed (i.e. E911 Surcharge, Museum Grants). (GASB 2300.106(12)) **EXCEPTION:** The restricted Snow Removal resources in the Highway Fund shall only be expended on snow removal when the amount spent in a fiscal year exceeds cost for an average years snow removal.

RESOLUTION #13-15 ANTIFRAUD PROGRAMS AND CONTROLS (SAS 99)

WHEREAS, the Statement of Auditing Standards (SAS) #99 indicates than management is responsible for designing and implementing systems and procedures for the prevention and detection of fraud and for ensuring a culture and environment that promotes honesty and ethical behavior.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Brown County Commission adopt the following (an expanded version of many may exist in the personnel policy manual):

ORGANIZATIONAL CODE OF CONDUCT: The County and its employees must, at all times, comply with all applicable laws and regulations. The county will not condone the activities of employees who achieve results through violation of the law or unethical business dealings. This includes any payments for illegal acts, indirect contributions, rebates, and bribery. The county does not permit any activity that fails to stand the closest possible public scrutiny.

Employees uncertain about the application or interpretation of any legal requirements should refer the matter to their superior, who, if necessary, should seek legal advice.

GENERAL EMPLOYEE CONDUCT: The County expects its employees to conduct themselves in a businesslike manner. Drinking, gambling, fighting, swearing, and similar unprofessional activities are strictly prohibited while on the job. Employees must not engage in sexual harassment, or conduct themselves in a way that could be construed as such, for example, by using inappropriate language, keeping or posting inappropriate materials in their work area, or accessing inappropriate materials on their computer.

<u>CONFLICTS OF INTEREST</u>: The County expects that employees will perform their duties conscientiously, honestly, and in accordance with the best interests of the county. Employees must not use their position or knowledge gained as a result of their position for private or personal advantage.

GIFTS, ENTERTAINMENT, AND FAVORS: Employees must not accept significant entertainment, gifts, or personal favors that could, in any way, influence, or appear to influence, business decisions in favor of any person or organization with whom or with which the county has, or is likely to have, business dealings.

<u>KICKBACKS AND SECRET COMMISSIONS</u>: The County strictly prohibits the acceptance of kickbacks and secret commissions from suppliers or others. Any breach of this rule will result in immediate suspension and prosecution to the fullest extent of the law.

<u>COUNTY RESOURCES</u>: Assets of the county are for county purposes only and not for personal benefit. This includes the personal use of organization assets, such as computers and other equipment.

ORGANIZATION RECORDS AND COMMUNICATIONS: The employees responsible for accounting and recordkeeping must fully disclose and record all assets, liabilities or both, and must exercise diligence in enforcing these requirements. Employees must not make or engage in any false record or communication of any kind including false expense, attendance, financial or similar reports and statements.

<u>PRIVACY AND CONFIDENTIALITY</u>: Employees and members of the governing board should be aware of restrictions to public access in areas such as medical records, economic development and executive sessions.

WHEREAS, SDCL 10-6-35.2 authorizes the board of county commissioners, at its discretion, to adopt any formula for assessment of specifically "Industrial" classified structures.

WHEREAS, SDCL 10-6-35.2 states the formula may include for any or all of the five tax years following construction all, any portion or none of the assessed valuation for tax purposes.

WHEREAS, consistent with the provisions of SDCL 13-13-20.4, the South Dakota Department of Revenue and Regulation does not seek to recoup lost local effort to the extent a 20, 40, 60, 80, 100% formula is adopted for the 5 year period.

WHEREAS, the current discretionary formula allows the level of assessment for all qualifying structures to be 0% of assessed value for the 1st year, 0% for the 2nd, 0% for the 3rd, 0% for the 4th and 0% of assessed value for the 5th year.

WHEREAS, the county hopes all eligible projects will avail themselves of the formula and exercise their responsibility to apply.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Brown County Board of Commissioners hereby adopts a new discretionary formula as authorized by SDCL 10-6-35.2 for those structures specifically classified pursuant to SDCL 10-6-35.1 with an industrial zoning classification. The level of assessment for the above listed specifically classified structures shall be 0% of assessed value for the 1st year, 0% for the 2nd, 0% for the 3rd, 0% for the 4th, and 0% of assessed value for the 5th year. The resolution shall be applied beginning the 2017 assessment year. Dated this 1st day of September 2015.

Machinery and Equipment - \$5,000

Infrastructure - \$25,000

Bridges – Structures greater than 20' (SDCL 31-14)

Roads – composite method: entire system including base, culverts and gravel surface Paved Road New Construction – composite method, with definition of new construction being 2" overlay or greater for distance exceeding one mile.

Personal Property Listings – All county departments are required to file an additional personal property list, to be used for tracking items with an original cost of less than \$5,000 for purposes of theft and/or disaster recovery and insurance coverage.

- 3. Interest earnings will be recorded in the respective county funds applicable.
- 4. Restricted and Unrestricted Resource Policy: When both restricted and unrestricted resources are available for use, it is the policy of Brown County to use restricted resources first, then unrestricted resources as they are needed.

AND FURTHER RESOLVE that Brown County chooses not to prepare the optional Management's Discussion Analysis.
