INTEREST POLICY:

Moved by Fischbach, seconded by Sutton to approve the following Policy in regard to interest earned from deposits and investments: State law allows income from deposits and investments to be credited to either the General Fund or the fund making the investment. The County's policy is to credit all income from deposits and investments to the General Fund, except for interest earned on specific certificates of deposits and financial assurance savings account of the Solid Waste Fund. USGAAP requires income from deposits and investments to be reported in the fund whose assets generated that income. Where the governing board has discretion to credit investment income to a fund other than the fund that provided the resources for investment, a transfer to the designated fund is reported. - A. Temporary malt beverage, wine, or liquor licenses in conjunction with a special event to any civic, charitable, educational, fraternal or veterans organizations may be issued to said group at a cost of \$50.00 per day for malt beverage; \$50 per day for wine, and \$100 per day for liquor.
- B. Temporary malt beverage licenses in conjunction with a special event may be issued to any person holding a malt beverage or on-sale alcoholic beverage license issued by Brown County at the cost of \$150.00 per day; and
- C. Temporary wine licenses in conjunction with a special event may be issued to any person holding an on-sale wine retailers license or an off-sale package wine dealers license issued by Brown County at a cost of \$150.00 per day;
- D. Temporary liquor licenses in conjunction with a special event may be issued to any person holding an on-sale alcoholic beverage license issued by Brown County at a cost of \$200.00 per day;
- E. Each above-described license shall not exceed fifteen consecutive days in length;
- F. That the licensee must comply with all applicable state laws concerning the consumption of alcoholic beverages as set forth in SDCL ch. 35-4.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the County of Brown, South Dakota, as follows:

If the applicant already holds an on-sale alcoholic beverage or a malt beverage license or if the license is to be used in a publicly owned facility, it is not necessary to have a hearing on the temporary application and the number of licenses that may be issued to any person in any calendar year is (24) twenty-four. DESCRETIONARY FORMULA SPECIFIC HISTORICAL DISTRICT:

RESOLUTION #20-16

WHEREAS, the Aberdeen Commercial Historic District is the area in the City of Aberdeen within the border of 6th Avenue SE/SW on the south, Railroad Avenue SE/SW on the north, the public alley right-of-way between Main Street S. and 1st Street S. on the west, and the public alley right-of-way between Main Street S. and Lincoln Street S. on the east.

WHEREAS, the Aberdeen City Council, pursuant to SDCL 11-8-4, designated the Aberdeen Commercial Historic District an urban renewal area.

WHEREAS, the Brown County Board of Commissioners has currently adopted a "discretionary formula" for the assessment of certain structures in Brown County.

WHEREAS, SDCL 10-6-35.2 and SDCL 10-6-35.22 authorize the Brown County Board of Commissioners, at its discretion, to adopt any formula for assessment of new industrial or commercial structures or additions, renovation, or reconstruction to existing structures, which new structures or additions, renovation, or reconstruction have a full and true value of thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000) or more, located within a designated urban renewal area as defined in SDCL 11-8-4.

WHEREAS, SDCL 10-6-35.2 states the formula may include for any or all of the five tax years following construction all, any portion, or none of the assessed valuation for tax purposes.

WHEREAS, consistent with the provisions of SDCL 13-13-20.4, the South Dakota Department of Revenue and Regulation does not seek to recoup lost local effort to the extent a 20, 40, 60, 80, 100% formula is adopted for the 5 year period.

WHEREAS, the current discretionary formula allows the level of assessment for all qualifying structures, per SDCL 10-6-35.22 to be 20% of assessed value for the 1st year, 40% for the 2nd year, 60% for the 3rd year, 80% for the 4th year, and 100% for the 5th year, provided that the assessed valuation during any of the five years may not be less than the assessed valuation of the property in the year preceding the first year of the tax years following construction.

WHEREAS, the adoption of the discretionary formula authorized by SDCL 10-6-35.2 shall be concurrent with, and have no effect upon, existing municipal tax assessments for a business improvement district and a parking district that include the Aberdeen Commercial Historic District.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Brown County Board of Commissioners hereby adopts a new discretionary formula as authorized by SDCL 10-6-35.2 for those structures within the urban renewal area known as the Aberdeen Commercial Historic District specifically classified pursuant to SDCL 10-6-35.22, which new structures or additions, renovation, or reconstruction have a full and true value of thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000.00) or more. The level of assessment for qualifying structures shall be 0% of assessed value for the 1st year, 0% for the 2nd year, 0% for the 3rd year, 0% for the 4th year, and 0% for the 5th year. The assessed valuation during any of the five years may not be less than the assessed valuation of the property in the year preceding the first year of the tax years following construction. The resolution shall be applied beginning November 1, 2016 for the 2017 assessment year and shall end at the 2028 assessment year, which begins November 1, 2017 for completed projects.

Recitals and History

- A. On March 21, 1949, Brown County acquired the following property for highway purposes: Lot H-2 in the Northwest Quarter (NW¼), Section Twenty-eight (28), Township One Hundred Twenty-eight North (128N), Range Sixty-two (62), West of the 5th P.M., Liberty Township, BrownCounty, SouthDakota, containing0.83 acres, more or less.
- B. A copy of the right-of-way plat is attached hereto and incorporated herein.
- C. The highway deed was recorded in Book 141 of Deeds, page 331. The conveyance explicitly declared that the transfer was for "highway purposes".
- D. Brown County built a curve on Lot H-2 at the intersection of Brown County Highway 5 and Brown County Highway 16.
- E. Brown County later closed the curve, marked the curve as unpassable, and removed dirt from the surface of the road, thereby rendering it unusable for public travel. Brown County has no plans to re-open the curve for public travel.
- F. Pursuant to SDCL 31-19-60, when lands acquired as public use easements are no longer required for highway use, the Board of Commissioners shall adopt a resolution to that effect and such lands shall revert to the former owner or his assigns.
- G. The current owners of the NW¼28-128N-62W requested that Brown County follow SDCL 31-19-60 by formally abandoning Lot H-2 and restoring possession to such owners.
- H. Brown County and landowners reached an agreement regarding abandonment and restoration of the property.

- I. Brown County, by and through its highway department, has completed the following actions in order to preserve the integrity of County Highways 5 and 16:
 - (1) County removed the road surface (bituminous material and gravel base) from Lot H-2 for use on other county highway projects to prevent such undesirable materials from being included in the resulting agricultural land.
 - (2) County did all of the dirt work to remove the curve from Lot H-2 and shaped the highway shoulders, slope, and ditches along County Highway 5 and County Highway 16 so they conform to County highway standards.
 - (3) County used some dirt to widen the southeast corner of the intersection of County Highways 5 and 16 to allow longer vehicles to more easily navigate the corner.
 - (4) County spread the remaining soil to level the curve area to prepare it for agricultural production by landowners.
