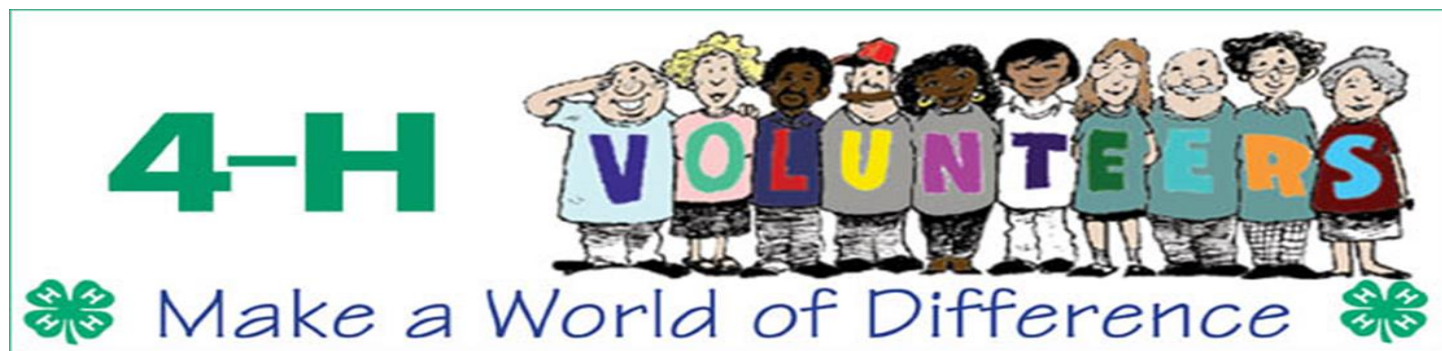

### 2020-2021 Volunteer Renewal/Enrollment Process

All Brown County 4-H volunteers must pay a \$10 re-enrollment fee for the new 4-H year. Be sure to talk to your club leader to determine if they will cover the cost or if the individual volunteer is responsible. The checks should be made out to the **State 4-H Office**. Any NEW volunteers must fill out the work agreement form (which can be found on the SDSU Extension website or 4Honline), they will also need to submit the \$10 fee and will have a background check completed by the State Office. The forms and checks for volunteers should also be sent to the Brown County 4-H Office by December 15th as they will be mailed in with the renewal fees. The Brown County 4-H Office will mail in all the checks at one time. It is extremely important that all fees and forms are turned in on time. Per the State Office, Lapsed Volunteers - \$75 and Volunteer Work Agreement. Please contact the Brown County 4-H Office if you have any questions on this process.



**New South Dakota 4-H Volunteer Orientation Course Requirement**

Starting November 1st, any new volunteers will need to complete the SD 4-H Volunteer Orientation Course. The course is through Training House ([traininghouse.sdstate.edu](http://traininghouse.sdstate.edu)), self-guided, broken into six required sections and one optional section. Each section has a video that is 8-12 minutes long with a short review quiz and evaluation at the end. All three elements must be completed in order to complete the course. Volunteers will need to self-enroll. Enrollment instructions are attached. Volunteers should complete this course after their interview with a local 4-H professional and complete in the time waiting for their background check to be complete. The course can be done over the course can be broken up as needed. Volunteers will be able to start and go back-in to access the course. The background check and course must be completed before the State 4-H office will approve the volunteer in 4-H Online and be cleared to begin volunteering.

Any and all current volunteers with South Dakota 4-H are also encouraged to complete the course as a way to further develop their volunteer skills! Information is relevant to not just new volunteers, but will be helpful for everyone working with our 4-H youth. While it is not required to complete the course as a current volunteer, I would ask that anyone accessing the course complete evaluation components, so we know how many participated.

## **YQCA Information—Mandatory Training Required**

YQCA certification is being accepted by many livestock shows and fairs that require youth quality assurance certification. Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) is a national multi-species quality assurance program for youth ages 8 to 21. The program is designed to provide an estimated 60 minutes of education each year. The online program requires the passing of a series of three quizzes to earn certification. An in-person YQCA workshop requires complete attendance. YQCA is the result of a collaborative effort between states that have previously offered multi-species youth livestock quality assurance programs, the National Pork Board's Youth PQA Plus program and representatives from other national livestock groups. YQCA is available as an online or face to face program for youth everywhere in the United States. YQCA in-person workshops may be available to youth where state 4-H or FFA offices or state/national livestock organizations have partnered to have qualified trainers offer in-person workshops. Brown County's face to face training dates are tentatively scheduled for the following (please note these dates could change so be sure to pay attention to future Newshounds and the Brown County 4-H Facebook page:

## 4-H Online 2.0

It is hard to believe that this has been in the works for around 4 years, but we are finally transitioning to the updated version of 4-H Online. 4-H members and volunteers are able to log in and complete their enrollment. The website address is: <https://v2.4honline.com>. Please make sure that families know the new website address. If families log into [sd.4honline.com](https://sd.4honline.com), they will not be able to register.

Below are a few tips as we work through this transition.

1. Help Sheets for the families are attached. They are also available on the SDSU Extension Website: <https://extension.sdstate.edu/4honline-fairentry>
2. Clubs are referred to as Units in the new system.
3. All 4-H Members (new and old) will need to select their projects this year as it is not pre-populated this year. Also, encourage your members to add any projects that they plan on being in. There is not a limit on the number of project areas they can sign up for. Once they complete their enrollment, they cannot add more projects into the new system, the county office will need to add them.
  - a. Cloverbuds will only be able to sign up for the Cloverbud project area.
4. As you will see on the Health Information Page there are more fields this year. Most are not required, but the families can answer them if they want. If they are required, it will state required. If they missed a required area, they will not be allowed to the next page.

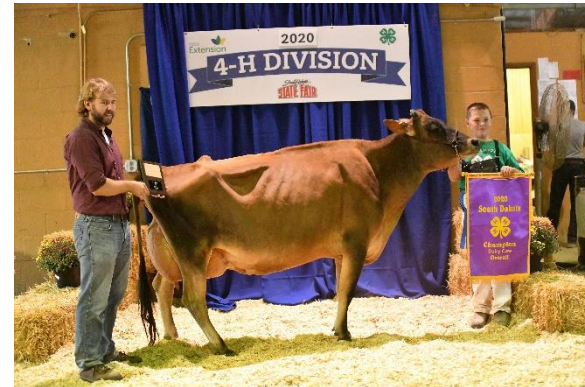
