NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Brown County Treasurer is hereby directed to invest Brown County public funds at the highest rate of interest possible at said time on available monies at financial institutions, as designated by the Brown County Commission, and

FURTHER, to furnish quarterly reports detailing same, as authorized by SDCL 4-5-8.

INTEREST POLICY:

The County's policy is to credit all income from deposits and investments to the General Fund during the year, except for interest earned on specific certificates of deposits for the Solid Waste Fund. USGAAP requires income from deposits and investment income to a fund other than the fund that provided the resources for investment, a transfer to the designated fund is reported when authorized by the Commission. Fund transfers of investment earnings to the General Fund shall not occur in 2022, all funds shall receive the income generated from the assets of the fund. All members present voting aye. Whereas, the Vietnam War was fought in Vietnam from 1961 to 1975, and involved North Vietnam and the Viet Cong in conflict with the United States Armed Forces and South Vietnam; and

Whereas, the United States became involved in Vietnam because policymakers in the United States believed that if South Vietnam fell to a Communist government then Communism would spread throughout the rest of Southeast Asia; and

Whereas, members of the United States Armed Forces began serving in an advisory role in the South Vietnamese in 1961; and

Whereas, as a result of the Gulf of Tonkin incidents on August 2, 1964, and August 4, 1964, Congress overwhelmingly passed the Gulf of Tonkin Resolution, on August 7, 1964, which effectively handed over war-making powers to President Johnson until such time as "peace and security" had returned to Vietnam; and

Whereas, in 1965, United States Armed Forces ground combat units arrived in Vietnam; and

Whereas, by the end of 1965, there were 80,000 United States troops in Vietnam, and by 1969 a peak of approximately 543,000 troops was reached; and

Whereas, on January 27, 1973, the Treaty of Paris was signed, which required the release of all United States prisoners-of-war held in North Vietnam and the withdrawal of all United States Armed Forces from South Vietnam; and

Whereas, on March 29, 1973, the United States Armed Forces completed the withdrawal of combat troops from Vietnam; and

Whereas, more than 58,000 members of the United States Armed Forces lost their lives in Vietnam and more than 300,000 members of the Armed Forces were wounded; and

Whereas, members of the United States Armed Forces, who served bravely and faithfully for the United States during the Vietnam War, were caught upon their return home in the crossfire of public debate about the involvement of the United States in the Vietnam War; and

Whereas, it was also the first time in history America failed to welcome its veterans back as heroes; and

Whereas, the establishment of a "Welcome Home Vietnam Veterans Day" would be an appropriate way to honor those members of the United States Armed Forces who served in Vietnam during the Vietnam War; and

RESOLUTION #33-22

A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING A TEMPORARY MORATORIUM ON THE ISSUANCE OF CONDITIONAL USE PERMITS AND BUILDING PERMITS ON HAZARDOUS WASTE PIPELINES IN BROWN COUNTY, SOUTH DAKOTA.

WHEREAS, to promote the health, safety, and general welfare of the County, the Board of Commissioners for Brown County adopted Title 4 Brown County Zoning Ordinances for the purpose of establishing zoning regulations upon all land within the unincorporated areas of Brown County, South Dakota; and

WHEREAS, Title 4 otherwise known as the Brown County Zoning Ordinance, categorizes all land within the unincorporated areas of Brown County into Districts with each District having its own unique set of permitted uses, conditional uses, and prohibited uses; and

WHEREAS, Title 4.0102 of the Brown County Zoning Ordinance defines a conditional use as a use that would not be appropriate generally or without restriction throughout the zoning division or district, but which, if controlled as to number, area, location, or relation to the neighborhood, would promote the public health, safety, welfare, morals, order, comfort, convenience, appearance, prosperity, or general welfare, and such uses may be permitted in a zoning district as conditional uses, as specific provisions for such exception are made Brown County zoning regulations, and conditional uses are subject to evaluation and approval by the Board of Adjustment and are administrative in nature. (Ord. 2004-1); and

WHEREAS, Title 4.0102 of the Brown County Zoning Ordinance states a transmission pipeline may mean a pipeline that transports hazardous liquid or gas within a storage field or

transports hazardous liquid or gas user or operates at a hoop stress of twenty percent or more of the specified minimum yield strength and that a "water service main" or a natural gas service main are meant as smaller mains, service lines and utility lines for servicing buildings or individual parcels and would not qualify as a transmission pipeline; and

WHEREAS, Transmission Pipelines, particularly those requiring the approval of the South Dakota Public Utilities Commission, can impact the public health, safety, welfare, morals, order, comfort, convenience, appearance, prosperity, or general welfare of a large portion of Brown County's population: and

WHEREAS, Brown County has enacted an ordinance establishing siting, or performance standards necessary for the granting of transmission pipeline conditional use permit, but said ordinance may need to be revised to ensure it is consistent with South Dakota and Federal law The Brown County Zoning Board of Adjustment requires time to begin the process of studying, reviewing South Dakota and Federal law, and the siting and performance standards that it believes are necessary to safeguard the health ,safety, and general welfare of the public prior to the issuance of a transmission pipeline conditional use permit.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Brown County Commissioners does hereby impose a temporary moratorium on the issuance of any and all permits, licenses, or approvals for the construction, installation, or use of any transmission pipeline requiring the approval of the South Dakota Public Utilities Commission, traversing those lands contained within the unincorporated areas of Brown County, South Dakota, including the construction of any transmission pipeline related infrastructure, with said moratorium running for such a length of time that will give the Planning and Zoning Commission an opportunity to complete their review process or one year from the date of this Resolution is enacted.

RESOLUTION #44-22

Resolution No. 44-22, granting BDM Rural Water System, Inc., a county-wide authorization for the purpose of the continued placement, repair, and maintenance of pipeline and related appurtenances and the construction and maintenance of new pipeline and related appurtenances for the Brown County portion of the BDM Rural Water System, Inc., water system.

BDM Rural Water System, Inc. applied to the Brown County Board of the County Commissioners for authorization to construct, repair, and maintain its water system on, over, across, or under public highways and rights-of-way for the purpose of providing rural water service in Brown County, South Dakota. Notice was duly given by mail of the application of BDM Rural Water System, Inc. to all persons, firms, or corporations owning or operating electric, telephone, or telegraph lines within Brown County, South Dakota, in compliance with SDCL § 31-26-13. All comments received were considered by the Brown County Commissioners. This resolution was adopted according to SDCL Ch. 31-26, and in particular SDCL § 31-26-24 and 31-26-25 by the Brown County Board of County Commissioners at a regular meeting, which was held in the Commissioner's Room in the Courthouse in the City of Aberdeen, Brown County, South Dakota, on the 30th day of August, 2022. All Commissioners were present. After discussion, the following resolution was numbered 44-22 and upon motion duly made, seconded, and carried was unanimously adopted:

BE IT RESOLVED that BDM Rural Water System, Inc., a South Dakota Non-profit Corporation, will be allowed and permitted to run an underground pipeline for transmitting water or all purposes for which said corporation was formed along any and all public rights-of-way, including pipelines, appurtenances, all rights-of-way between all sections in Brown County, South Dakota, so long as said transmission and distribution pipe is buried, so as not to interfere with the building of any roads or causing any liability to the County.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that BDM Rural Water System, Inc. will bear the expenses or costs associated in the construction and operating of the water system.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that when a pipeline is installed in the public right-ofway, such right-of-way must be restored to as near its original condition.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the installation of such pipeline and appurtenances in the public right-of-way will conform to plans and specifications to be submitted to the County, prior to construction, for review and comment, and must include the following conditions:

1. Notice Prior to Starting Work: Before starting construction work, a Right - of - Way Occupancy Permit must be obtained from the Brown County Commission.

2. Minimum Interference with Traffic: All work will be planned and carried out so as to minimize inconvenience to the traveling public.

3. Storage of Material: Not material may be stored within eight feet from the edge of pavement or traveled way or within the shoulder line unless otherwise approved by the County Highway Superintendent.

4. Clean Up Right-of-Way: Upon completion of work, litter will be removed from the rightof-way, and it will be left in as presentable a condition as before work started.

5. Care of Drainage: If the contemplated work interferes with established drainage, provisions will be incorporated in the project during construction to maintain normal drainage.

6. Location Plans: Upon completion of the work, a copy of the "as built" drawings will be furnished to the County for their records and use.

7. Maintenance: The pipelines and appurtenances placed in the County right-of-way will be maintained and reasonable care exercised in inspecting and repairing any portion of the right-of-way and pay all expenses or costs to the County which occurs as a result of the operation and maintenance of the pipelines and appurtenances.

8. All Roadways: Pipelines installed perpendicular to roadways will be installed by boring or jacking methods. Pipelines installed longitudinally in a right-of-way will be by an open cut. Minimum of one lane will be left clear and open to traffic at all times. All lanes will remain clear and open during the hours of darkness.

9. Depth of Pipelines: Pipelines will be placed to a depth of cover consistent with design standards for water pipelines for the area. Where additional pipeline cover is necessary to accommodate future roadways, vertical and horizontal roadway designed clearances, the County will so advise BDM Rural Water System, Inc. at the time of the County review of the need for change in pipeline cover.

OPPORTUNITY FOR PUBLIC COMMENT:

LeAnn Frederickson and Dawn Shepard discussed concerns and why they are opposed to the 4-way stop at intersection of Co. #14W and Co. #10. Mentioned they are circulating petitions. If goes through ask to have either Flashing Caution Lights, Flashing Stop Lights or suggested putting in a round about at that intersection. Another Safety concern is the wide turns the semis need to take.

SUMMIT CARBON SOLUTIONS:

Dana Siefkes Lewis with Summit Carbon Solution introduced herself to the Commission and stated she is an Advocate for the residents of Brown and Spink County. There are 200 Ethanol plants and 70 of those will be on this pipeline. Aaron Eldridge, Project Manager with Summit Carbon Solutions discussed the process for laying the pipeline, and they are going a foot deeper than required and the testing they put the pipes through looking for any leaks. He shared there will be 4 pump stations that will be inside shelters and have Cellular & Radio access. They must follow the route that they submitted to PUC for their permit. They are compensating landowners; landowners don't need to increase insurance. If a landowner has Drain Tile and repairs are needed, they have a company that will repair for the lifetime of the project, or they will compensate landowners if they have another contract. Landowners will have permanent easement but can not plant any trees or something with roots over the structure but can build next to it. They will try to go around shelter belts but that is not always possible. Landowners will be compensated for loss on crops for 3 years and after that if crops in that area are not producing as well as the rest of the crops – they will pay the difference on yields for lifetime of the project. Commissioner Feickert asked for a list of investors, and they stated they can't give them everyone, only those that allow them to share their information – one of them is based out of South Korea.

OCTOBER 25, 2022 - GENERAL MEETING

Meeting called to order by Chairman Sutton at 8:45 A.M. in the Commission Chambers, Courthouse Annex, Brown County, SD. Present were Commissioners Feickert, Fjeldheim, Gage, Wiese, and Sutton Commissioner. Auditor Heupel led the Pledge of Allegiance.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA:

OPPORTUNITY FOR PUBLIC COMMENT: Dave Meyer with Summit Carbon Solutions commented that he was here if anyone had any questions.

INDIGENT COUNSEL PROPOSAL:

Ernest Thompson, State's Attorney shared there are 8 attorneys that sent in a proposal for a 2-year period; January 1, 2023 to December 31, 2024. Annual payment of \$750,000.00 for calendar year 2023/equal installments of \$7,812.50 and \$800,000.00 for calendar year 2024/ equal installments of \$8,333.33. This being the only bid Ernest recommended to accept the bid and can start contract negotiations. Moved by Fjeldheim, seconded by Gage to accept the proposal then move forward with Contract Negotiations. All members present voting aye. Motion carried.

JAIL PROJECT:

Dave Lunzman, Sheriff Chief Deputy and Ernest Thompson, State's Attorney met with the Commission to discuss the Jail Project and heighten the awareness and importance of this need. The current jail is 56 years old, no longer meets expectations, needs upgrades, too small. Current capacity is 48 beds – estimate new jail could hold around 200 beds. They stressed to the Commission that we need to either build a new facility or we will be spending money to transfer prisoners to other states because this is a problem across the state. If they end up having to transport prisoners than our expenses will go up. Federal prisoners can be brought in to help cover some of the costs. Commissioner Sutton shared that Commissioner Wiese and himself have been contacting other counties to see if they are interested in the Regional Jail – Aberdeen being a good location due to having 2 hospitals, NE Mental Health Center and staffing. Representative Perry shared they have a Regional Jail meeting in Pierre on November 1st; there is a possibility of some funding coming from the State to help with this project, also. Was discussed that they want to have rehabilitation programs, which would be another benefit but don't have the ability to do that right now. Deputy Lunzman shared that they don't have any Trustees in jail right now, they are violent criminals that can't be trusted so need to be incarcerated.

TOWNSHIP RURAL ACCESS INFRASTRUCTURE FUNDING (RAIF):

Dirk Rogers, Highway Superintendent presented plans from 3 Townships for 5 culverts. Greenfield Township 1 application for \$10,500/ 5 yr. plan; Groton Township 2 applications for \$12,500 ea./5 yr. plan; Liberty Township 2 applications for \$18,500 ea./5 yr. plan.
