- **What is this event and what is it about:**
 - This event is a fun, casual summer festival for people to come out and enjoy the end of the summer, listen to some music, ride some carnival rides, eat great food and attend a variety of entertainment, something for everyone to their comfort level.
 - Most of the events take place Wed. Aug. 12 – Sat. Aug. 15 at the county fairgrounds. Some pre-fest events at the Odde will begin Fri. Aug. 7.
- **Why have this event if the Brown County Fair was cancelled:**
 - This event was asked for by area residents and promoters who wanted to end the summer on a positive note with some good entertainment and things for families to do that would minimize their exposure in a smaller gathering instead of a full-blown fair which attracts far more people.

- **What safety precautions will be available**
 - Hand washing stations will be available throughout the grounds; promoters will be responsible for providing hand sanitizing stations in the clubhouse, grandstand and livestock barns.
 - Most events are outdoors and we encourage people to use their best judgment when it comes to social distancing, wearing masks and not attending if they do not feel well.
- **Now that major retailers, such as Wal-mart, Target and Menards are requiring customers to wear masks in their stores, will people be required to wear masks at the summer fest?**
 - We encourage guests to wear masks and to also follow the CDC guidelines for preventing the spread of COVID19 such as; frequent hand washing, avoid touching your face, cover your nose and mouth in public and stay home if you are not feeling well. However, there are no official mandates for wearing masks in public and at this point in time, the public should be aware that visiting events such as this involves assuming exposure risk typical of all public places.
