In light of the current COVID-19 Pandemic, The Brown County Sheriff's Office is making every effort to ensure the safety of our inmates, staff, Law Enforcement Officers and the general public. We are screening new arrests for COVID-19 symptoms and our medical staff is working closely with the State and Local Department of Health as well as a local Physician and we have the tools available if it's deemed that testing for COVID-19 is warranted. We are also screening our staff for COVID-19 symptoms and following the same testing protocol if deemed necessary.

We have implemented several changes to the day to day operations of our facility but the main one that will affect the public will be the change to our visitation policy. All non-essential visits are now limited to video visitation only. Any necessary visits such as those with Attorneys and Mental Health Professionals that cannot be done via video are taking place in a room designated for those purposes where the risk of possible exposure to COVID-19 is very minimal.

We are also following CDC guidelines for cleaning and disinfection in all areas of our Sheriff's Office, Jail and Juvenile Detention Center
