Brown County Home Detention Community Service/Mentoring Release

The Home Detention Program participates in mentoring and community service projects for at risk youth within the community. The Home Detention staff helps organize various projects to get youth involved in positive activities.

The Community Service projects are mandatory for all Home Detention juveniles. Exceptions will be made for those juveniles who are employed and are scheduled to work. If a juvenile has Community Service hours, they will be required to work on and/or complete them while on Home Detention.

The Community Service projects may require them to operate tools or small machinery such as lawn mowers. Your child may be painting, picking up garbage, shoveling snow, doing yard work for the elderly, or other projects for various organizations in the community.

The Mentoring projects are voluntary and can be at the discretion of the parents and/or the juvenile to participate. The Mentoring projects may include bowling, biking, attending movies, skating, mini golf, picnics, disc golf or many other positive activities within the community. These activities are free of charge for the youth to attend. Snacks and beverages are usually not provided unless donated by area businesses.
